


<u>River North Residents Association supports hyperlocal movement</u> with launch of My River North mobile app

The user's mobile device GPS technology further customizes the experience by locating nearby parks and, for efficient transportation planning, provides direction to Divvy bike stations and parking near the user's current location. There is also a link to the RTA Trip Planner.



The benefits of *My River North* are even greater for the 11,000+ members of the River North Residents Association and the employees of participating app merchants. These users are given a special code that unlocks exclusive deals at local merchants. With over 50 participating merchants across 14 categories including Beauty/Fitness, Entertainment, Kids, Pets, Restaurants, and Retail, there is sure to be a deal for everyone.

The *My River North* app is the latest innovation from the River North Residents Association (RNRA) which is celebrating its 20th anniversary in 2017. According to Mike Riordan, RNRA President, "the *My River North* app supports our core reason for being – to make River North Chicago's premier neighborhood – and, through the latest technology, extend our commitment to quality of life by bringing residents together, connecting residents to local business, and collaborating with our elected officials and city agencies."

The app is also part of the Association's commitment to supporting the hyperlocal movement which also includes presenting the annual Taste of River North summer festival, underwriting a full slate of annual Chicago Parks Movies in the Park at A.
